Arbutus unedo - by Liam McCaughey

Continuing the red theme of October, there is double value in the garden now with the Arbutus unedo, being simultaneously in flower and in fruit. Known as the strawberry tree - but the fruits are bitter (its name unedo implies 'eat one only') - though the blackbirds don't find a problem and are gorging on them this month.





Arbutus is essentially a Mediterranean tree, but there are relict populations in Ireland, in Killarney and round Lough Gill in Sligo. In Irish mythology it arose from a fruit brought by the Tuatha De Danaan from the Land of Promise.
